Save Crystal River has received a generous \$90,000 donation from Deborah MacArthur Anderson and her foundation, the SHERLOQ Group, to advance restoration and resiliency projects in Kings Bay and its surrounding ecosystems.

A longtime property owner in Crystal River, Anderson and her husband recently made the community their full-time home. As a member of the City of Crystal River Planning Commission, Anderson has been a strong advocate for sustainable growth and environmental preservation. "After learning about the exceptional work of Lisa Moore and the Board of Directors of Save Crystal River I wanted to help," said Anderson. "The efforts that have been made by the board members and wonderful dedicated volunteers fill my heart. I wish that everyone that cares about the future of our waterways will take the time to learn what has been done and that which needs to be continued now and on going."

The \$90,000 donation will be used in its entirety to continue the **restoration of Crystal River's springs, eelgrass planting, and with island resiliency**. These projects are essential to improving water quality, restoring vital habitats, and strengthening natural protections against storm surge and erosion.

"Deborah's generosity comes at a pivotal moment," said Lisa Moore, president of Save Crystal River. "Large-scale restoration projects require both public and private support, and this donation not only accelerates our current work but also positions us to attract additional grant funding. We are grateful for her leadership and commitment to safeguarding the river."

Save Crystal River has led transformative restoration efforts across Kings Bay for more than a decade, restoring over 112 acres of habitat, planting more than 650,000 eelgrass plants, removing more than 700 million pounds of Lyngbya and detrital material, and opening more than 850 previously unidentified spring vents.
