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Continuing Conservation & Stewardship in Scallop Season

The 2025 Crystal River scallop season runs from July 1st to September 24th. This 3 month season offers ample opportunity for scalloping in the Crystal River area. Continuing to adhere to established conservation and stewardship guidelines is strongly recommended.

- Respect marine life: Avoid disturbing manatees, sea turtles, and other marine life.
- **Responsible shell disposal:** Do not discard scallop shells in inshore waters or rivers; dispose of them in a trash receptable or in larger bodies of water where they can disperse. Piles of discarded scallop shells can create hazards for swimmers and damage seagrass habitat.
- **Release small scallops:** While not legally required, it's recommended to release scallops smaller than 1.5 2 inches (about the size of a golf ball) to allow them to mature and reproduce.
- Avoid overharvesting: Stick to the bag limits and only harvest what you plan to eat.

By following these guidelines, recreational scallopers can enjoy this activity while contributing to the long term health of Florida's valuable bay scallop population and the marine environment.
